

These Changes will be presented one at a time with the Committee rationale for their passage to this convention for your consideration.

We will present these with the more simple changes to get warmed up, please remember the time limits in our rules and try to be concise, there is a fair amount of work here, let's be respectful & efficient.

1. Article VI Section 4: striking the word "mail" and adding: [emailed and available on the Party website](#). This will cut down on mailing & printing costs, reduce deadline pressure from the need to prepare for printing, stuffing and mailing but still be distributed and available for those that look at them pre-convention. **Passed by Majority**
2. Article VI Section 5b: Striking the word "mail" and adding [available on the website and emailed](#) (different order for grammatical purposes). The rationale was the same as stated for the rules requirement, savings, timing, waste. **Passed by Majority**
3. Article IX Section 3b3: Adding the language [elected by the State Central Committee](#). This would allow our Treasurer, to continue to serve by removing the term limits that apply to our elected State Party officers. Many of you, especially State Central Delegates are aware of the work done to bring us through financially trying times and keep us not only in compliance, but with a realistic grasp of what we could accomplish as the Party continued to pay down debt and operate within our capacity. Deputy Chair Pascoe submitted this change because he understands the importance of continuity and competence in the finances of this organization, and the importance of retaining loyalty and talent. **Passed unanimously.**
4. Article V Section 3 Add I: Adding a new subsection in the area of the Constitution where provisions for endorsement are covered. Please quickly review the language if you have not already, (it has been available). The recommended status was a policy created in 2012 to enable the Party to support candidates in non-partisan races in districts where the Republican endorsement may not be so helpful. The language has been modified to give the local Party organization as much control and flexibility as possible. **Passed unanimously.**
5. Judicial District Changes  
Changes include restructuring of the Judicial District organization to mirror the Congressional District Organizations in configuration, operations and representation. A majority of the Committee felt the Judicial District Committees should be afforded the same considerations as Congressional Districts. **Passed by Majority**

Article V Section 3c: Strike all of c.

Article V Section 3h: Strike all reference to Judicial districts.

Article VI Section 2a: Adding language giving the JD's power to place 2 members on State Nominations Committee.

Article VII: Adding Section 4-language establishing structure & organizational parity with CD organization.

Article VII: Adding Section 5- language to mirror CD Process & Procedure.

Article VIII Section 3: Adding language to require BPOUs to vote for Judicial District Delegates.

Article IX Section 1b1: Adding language to mandate two JD seats on State Central Committee.

Article IX Section 1b5: Adding language to mandate Endorsed Judges have State Central Membership.

Article IX Section 2a: Adding #5, Mandating 1 JD member on State Executive Committee.

Article IX Section 4c Adding Language to mandate an annual meeting of State Chair & Deputy Chair & JD Chairs.

Article X.1.B Adding Language adding the ten JD Chairs to the State Central Committee.

Article XII: Strike Section 1- existing Language. Replace with Sections 1 -4 Mirroring language for CD organizational structure & operations.

A motion passed Committee to move all Judicial changes as one motion at the Convention.
