

# 2018 State Platform Committee Report

The following report includes the complete 2016 Platform approved at the 2016 State convention, plus new resolutions originated at the 2018 Precinct Caucuses and that passed one or more CD conventions.

Other items were identified as "sunset" items in 2016 and are required to be brought to this Convention for a reaffirming vote this year, and every two years thereafter, and will be deleted if they are not re-approved.

NEW resolutions not already in the platform appear in line with the Standing Platform and are denoted by underline. Resolutions which change the language of the current Standing Platform are marked with ~~striketrough~~ (for deletions) and underline (for new language). The original language will be restored if the new resolution is not accepted.

In the attached, you will find that every new resolution and every "sunset" plank has a recommendation from the committee. In addition to the recommendation, a reason may appear in the last column and the numbers in parentheses () indicate which CDs supported the resolution. Those recommendations are:

- "Y" means that this resolution or plank becomes part of the Standing Platform, not subject to sunset.
- "YS" means "Yes but Sunsetting." It goes (or stays) in the State Platform this year but must come up for a reaffirming vote at the next Convention.
- "N" means the sunsetted item is deleted from the Platform.
  - OR that the new resolution is not recommended for inclusion in the Platform

**NOTE: Prior to creating this report, EVERY resolution which passed one or more CD conventions was summarized into an "Action Agenda" and ranked by the number of CDs passing similar resolutions. This includes resolutions already in the Standing Platform, which normally would not be considered, as well as resolutions for which this committee might recommend a "No" vote for inclusion in the Platform. This Action Agenda will be shared with our statewide legislative leaders as the "resolutions expressing grassroots concerns," which they are, and should be considered as a basis for their election campaigns and subsequent legislative agenda.**

**ALL** new resolutions passed at the 2018 CD conventions are either included in this report or are already in the Standing Platform in some form. In some cases the language of the resolution may have been changed to fit it into the Platform's existing language, but every effort was made to maintain what we believed was the intent of the resolution.
